Emeth High School Activities Making an Impact

While in Israel, I realized something. I realized how close I was to becoming disconnected to my Judaism after my Bat Mitzvah. I feel like a lot of kids think of their Bar or Bat Mitzvah as a type of graduation. After years of studying and hard work they feel like they are finally done with their Jewish studies. No longer needing to come to



class every week for Hebrew school or for tutoring, they feel as if they no longer need to be involved. I feel like this was the case in our synagogue for the majority of teens before Rabbi Israel was brought to us.

I remember watching my brother finish his Bar Mitzvah and being so jealous that he was "done". I could not wait for the day of my Bat Mitzvah so I no longer had to attend Hebrew school, write speeches, practice prayers, and all the other means of hard work that comes with becoming a Jewish woman. After this day passed, though, my father told me that he was signing me up, against my will, for the new youth group – Emet Dor Kef - in the synagogue. I was furious. I did not understand why I still needed to learn about Judaism even though I was "finished". My dad, with a smirk on his face, looked me in the eyes and said that one day I would thank him.

Now after years in our teen group, reconnecting with Camp Newman, teaching in the Religious School, and just being involved with Congregation Emeth and Judaism, I am proud to say that I finally understand what my father means about thanking him one day. It scares me to think that I may not have gone to Israel without my further connection to Judaism after the age of thirteen. I cannot thank Rabbi Israel enough for pulling me in and not letting me go even though at the time it was not what I wanted. She has truly helped me develop into the person I am today and I would not be where I am without her help.

A Message from Rabbi Israel



The Time of the Season

A favorite Jewish exchange is: the holidays are early this year! And the regular answer: No, they are right on time. Because the Jewish calendar is based on the lunar cycle with adjustments, the holidays occur at different times on the secular/solar

calendar. But this year, all of us are in a state of shock! Erev Rosh Hashanah takes place only two days after Labor Day! The first day of Chanukah is Thanksgiving Day! How is that even possible?

This is the first time since 1899 that Rosh Hashanah has occurred this early and it will never occur earlier than September 5th again!

Cantor Paul Buch has written an explanation of this phenomenon and has given me permission to present it to you (in an edited and shortened form):

A number of factors figure into to determining Holy Day dates, but Rosh Hashanah always falls on the first of the Hebrew month of Tishrei. And, the New Year always begins 163 days after the first day of Passover. The exact mechanism for why this is so is a little too involved to thoroughly explain in this limited space, but I'll try to give you a basic understanding.



Our secular calendar is primarily a solar calendar. It takes approximately 365 1/4 days for the earth to go around one time, and the extra 1/4 day is addressed by

adding a full day (February 29) every 4 years. However, the Hebrew calendar blends two different ways of determining the boundaries of time- the solar cycle, the one of which we are most familiar, and the lunar cycle, which measures time as it related to the interplay of the

Earth and its moon as they dance their way through the days.

In the Hebrew calendar, the 15th of the month is always a full moon, and the 1st of the month is always a "new" moon when only the slightest sliver visible.

In order to keep our Holy Days and both solar and lunar calendars aligned with the proper seasons, it is necessary to make an even bigger correction than the secular calendar gets – our calendar inserts an entire month seven times in every 19 years. That is just what is happening in the coming year of 5774. We will have shanah m'ubberet, a "leap" (literally, "pregnant") year. We add an extra month of Adar (giving us Adar I and Adar II) just before the month of Nissan, when Passover occurs, so that it will take place at its normal time in the spring of 2014.

Paula Marsh, as we continue our innovative approach to Jewish learning. In response to feedback from parents, we have combined our Religious and Hebrew Schools into one program. This change means that all classes Pre – K through B'nai Mitzvah will be held on Tuesdays. There are no longer any classes on Fridays. Yom Kippur Study Session

This Yom Kippur is the 40th anniversary of the Yom Kippur War, which took place that year on October 5, 1973. The Yom Kippur War began with a surprise attack against Israel by Egypt and many days passed before the war turned and Israel was victorious. Much about Israel changed after the fateful war, including the perceptions of Israelis, Jews, and the world at large about Israel.

In the afternoon following our Yom Kippur services, at the end of our "break" between our morning services and our afternoon services, our tradition is to engage in study. This year, Rabbi Israel will lead us in a guided study about Israel. The United States has once again brought the Israelis and Palestinians to the peace table and we'll discuss the possibilities for peace. We'll talk about Iran and what it brings to region, and how the Middle East has changed.

Most Israelis agree that 1973 and the aftermath of the Yom Kippur War was traumatic for the State of Israel. Forty years later, what have we learned? Israel and the Jewish community outside of Israel has had four decades of intense debates over the lessons of Yom Kippur.

In addition to this, we'll discuss the activities of the Religious Action Center (RAC) and religious pluralism in general, and the Women of the Wall in particular.

Your ideas and viewpoints are most welcome for what promises to be a spirited discussion. The study session takes place in the sanctuary from 3:30-4:30 PM



With Honors - revised from an article published in Silicon Valley's Jewish Newspaper

One of Congregation Emeth's youth leaders, 17 the California Magical Mystery Quest, and two year old Joshua Toch, was selected this summer for multiple honors. The incoming senior honors student at Live Oak High School, where he is the school's Student Body Vice President, was selected by American Legion Post 217 in Gilroy to be one of its two representatives at the 2013 American Legion California Boys State. At Boy's State, he was elected Lieutenant Governor by the

1,041 attendees. He was then selected to be one of two Senators to represent the State of California at the 68th Annual American Legion Boys Nation in Washington, D.C., which was held July 19-27, 2013.

At Boys Nation, Joshua was selected from among 23 candidates to be his party's nominee for Boys Nation President. The Presidential debates, campaign speeches, and Presidential

election were all streamed live on Legion TV and were closely followed throughout the United States. Joshua was also honored for being selected for the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy, which was held from August 5-9, 2013.

Josh is a past President of Congregation Emeth's Emet Dor Kef ("Emeth's fun generation") Teen Group and has been a madrich (student teaching assistant) in the temple's Religious and Hebrew Schools for the past three years.

He is four time alumni of summer programs run by Camp Tawonga (San Francisco Jewish Federation), including the Northwest/Canada Quest,

summer programs at Camp Towanga itself. He also attended one summer at Camp Newman.

In the summer of 2012, Joshua was honored to have been selected as a member of the first class of Young Judaea's "I Speak Israel" (ISI) program, which was partially underwritten by the David Project, the only California participant on


