through a MUSSAR** lens.

- * Pirke Avot **Pirkei Avot**, which translates to English as **Sayings of the Ancestors** (**lit. fathers**), is a compilation of the ethical teachings and maxims passed down to the Rabbis, beginning with Moses and onwards. It is part of didactic Jewish ethical Mussar literature. Pirkei Avot is unique in Talmudic literature in that it is the only tractate dealing *solely* with ethical and moral principles; there is little or no laws found in Pirkei Avot. (edited from Wikipedia)
- ** Mussar is a Jewish ethical, educational and cultural movement that developed in the 19th century in Lithuania, particularly among Orthodox Lithuanian Jews. Mussar study offers a Jewish path of character development and spiritual growth leading to awareness, wisdom, and transformation.

Those looking for text study, those looking for personal transformation, and those looking for both will find opportunities in this class. Taught by Rabbi Israel, both a daytime – 11:00 AM -12:30 PM – and evening – 7:00-8:30 PM class will be offered, pending registration. Participation in the previously offered Mussar course is not a prerequisite for this class. For those who participated in that course, this will offer additional opportunities for further character development.
