Descriptions of Emeth Services

All evening services begin at 7:15 PM. All morning services begin at 10:30 AM.

***Shabbat Morning Service/TNT Torah 'N T'filah:** This service includes reading the weekly Torah portion and a sermon or teaching from the Rabbi. It is a complete Shabbat service.

***Friday Night Live:** This Erev Shabbat (Friday evening) service highlights the music of Shabbat. It is a full Shabbat service (no Torah service) with a sermon or teaching from the Rabbi.

***Shabbat Short 'N Sweet:** An informal short Erev Shabbat (Friday evening) service. Learn the meaning of the prayers and discuss the Torah portion of the week. Rabbi led, this service is especially appropriate for children of all ages as well as adults. It is part of the Religious School curriculum. Prayers for healing and Mourners Kaddish are included. It is preceded by a community dinner with Shabbat rituals.

***Shabbat at Home:** On certain weekends during the year, Congregation Emeth does not have community Shabbat services. Resources are available from the Congregation to facilitate a meaningful Shabbat dinner and Torah discussion in your home.

***Sunset Shabbat:** During summer, we often have an informal service, either outdoors in our beautiful Sukkah/Patio area, or in-the-round in the back of the Sanctuary.

With great anticipation of a spiritually meaningful High Holiday season, we are pleased to send you this letter with information regarding High Holy Days at Emeth. We have included the High Holy Day Schedule and the Registration form for the special program serving children age four years through third grade.

- Once services have begun, kindly use the side entrance (office door) of our Temple.
- The exception is those requiring the use of the handicap ramp, which is located in front of the building. Please tell an usher if you need the door opened.
- Please fill in all seats, including the middle seats in a row. And seating can usually be found in the front rows!
- A limited number of tallitot (plural of tallit, prayer shawl) can be found in the back of the sanctuary. Please bring your own if you have one. The tallit is worn Rosh Hashanah day (it is not worn Rosh Hashanah in the evening), Yom Kippur evening (Kol Nidre), and Yom Kippur day. Remind your teens to bring the beautiful tallit they received at their bar/bat mitzvah!
- Please return your Membership Renewal forms as quickly as possible after you receive them within the next two weeks. High Holiday tickets are a benefit of membership. If you are bringing guests with you to services, be aware that the cost of tickets for non-members for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services is \$300 for a family, \$150 for an individual and \$100 for a senior over 62 years of age. There is no charge for military, college students, or members of other congregations who have a verifying letter from their congregation. These tickets entitle your guests to attend all of our High Holy Day services. (Should your guests decide to join Congregation Emeth before December 31, 2018, we will apply any payment for tickets toward their membership fees.) To purchase tickets, please send the appropriate amount to Congregation Emeth, 17835 Monterey Street, Morgan Hill, CA 95037.

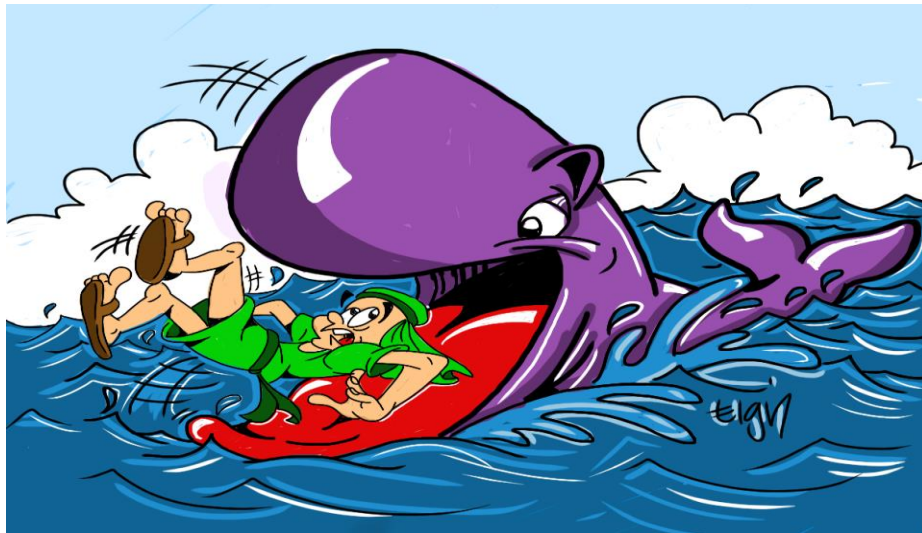

The shofar is an ancient musical instrument. In Jewish tradition, the shofar was sounded at the giving of the Ten Commandments, coronation of the king, public announcements, national events, and more. The purpose of the shofar is to "awaken those who slumber in spiritual lethargy." (Maimonides)

Funds and defrays costs for our loving support of members by providing meals and other services for families in need, including new parents, members who are ill, and members who have sustained a loss of a loved one.

RITUAL FUND - *Provides funding for cantorial soloists, purchasing supplies to build our Sukkah, and offering special holiday programs, such as our Purim carnival and Chanukah community celebration.*
