The refugee crisis from the Syrian civil war and fearful reactions to this crisis in late 2015 were the impetus for Rabbi Israel bringing together local clerical leaders to join in speaking out against bigotry, and racial or religious intolerance. Since then, this group, representing 18 local faith organizations, has presented a unified front, speaking for our common humanity—most recently in response to the Pittsburgh synagogue shootings in the summer of 2018.

Serving Monthly at The Lord's Table

"Safe Park" - Feeding the Homeless

Safe Park is a project provided through coordinated services from the City of Morgan Hill, the Morgan Hill Police Department, Social Services staff, and local faith organizations. Families currently living in their cars are given a safe place to park overnight, while agencies work with them to find permanent housing. The local Interfaith Community (ICSC) provides dinners every Friday, and Emeth, as a member of ICSC, takes on two months of Friday dinners a year. Seasonal Projects

High Holiday Food Drive

Emeth's teens ask members to bring in at bags of nonperishable food items and donations for *Mazon* (a Jewish response to hunger) between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. They subsequently distribute the bags to food pantries in Morgan Hill and Gilroy.

Dreidel Board Gift Program
